

About Niosha International Conservatory of Arts (NICArt)

7,630 miles, 12,279 kilometers, is the physical distance between California and Iran. Culturally, the differences span thousands of years, passed down through a rich history of dance, music, theater, food, and language. Heritage is conferred onto us when we are born. What happens when we are born into a culture that is both home and also 7,630 miles away from our deeply-rooted heritage? Can we integrate and pass down the rich heritage of our ancestral homeland while embracing the culture and customs of home?

As global and domestic changes hardened the attitudes of some towards different cultures, Niosha made the decision to create a new foundation dedicated to preserving and promoting all cultural traditions and heritage in America. In January 2018, the Niosha International Conservatory of Arts (NICArt) was approved as a **501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization** with the mission of promoting the arts, culture and literature of local communities by providing access to various creative experiences such as lessons in visual and performing arts, theater production, music instruction, language classes and various art programs.

Niosha Nafei Jamali created a home for the Persian heritage of the past and the new cultural evolution at NICArt (the Niosha International Conservatory of Arts). She could see the longing for a distant homeland within her community and the desire to preserve Iranian culture and traditions in this new home. The NICArt Foundation presents modern and traditional art forms that bridge time and space, connecting people from all cultures and walks of life.



When we sit in that darkened theater or walk through a well-lit gallery, our hearts expand to explore and understand experiences different from our own. Stories shared through sight, sound, color, or spoken word help us enter journeys of introspection, and we're opened up to interpretations of life through the eyes of others. Raised in Iran through high school, Niosha Nafei Jamali came to the United States to pursue an education in Psychology and Computer Science. She won the 1992 Miss Iran pageant in Los Angeles, CA. After college, Niosha founded Niosha Dance Academy (NDA), teaching modern and traditional dance to students of all ages. Growing into one of the most prolific Iranian dance schools in the nation. NDA paved the way for Niosha and her elite performers to tour the United States, performing at festivals, professional sporting events including NBA Warriors halftime show. She took her dance academy team to one of cable television's top shows, America's Got Talent. Niosha has been featured on VOA, Manoto, "Ladies' Home Journal", "San Francisco Chronicle"

and "Experience Life" Magazine. Niosha was realizing her dream of sharing the artistry of Persian dance, connecting with people from all walks of life and backgrounds.

In the midst of her career, Niosha's work almost ground to a halt at age 31 when she was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma and given a less than 40% chance of survival. Never one to be afraid of the odds, she rallied her optimism, and refusal to guit to recover from her disease. Her family and the Iranian Bay Area community drew in tight around her, supporting her miraculous recovery and her dream lived on. Niosha was stronger and even more determined to preserve and promote her culture as a staunch community-organizer with the belief that art is the common unifier of all peoples around the world. In January 2018, Niosha International Conservatory of Arts (NICArt) was approved as a nonprofit charitable organization, celebrating cultural diversity and harmony through art, music, theater, dance, and a united humanity. In March 2022, NICArt unveiled its feature-length musical, "The Story of Nowruz", at the San Mateo Performing Arts Center. The production garnered enthusiastic praise from local leaders, including mayors and board supervisors, as well as an appreciative audience, all contributing to its resounding success. Niosha lives in the Bay Area with her husband and children, amongst the community she loves.

Banafsheh Sayyad is an Iranian master sacred dancer, choreographer, transformational teacher, activist and founder of Dance of Oneness®. She performs and teaches internationally, initiating people into the wisdom of their bodies.

Banafsheh is among the few bearers of authentic Persian dance in the world and a pioneer in creating a liberated feminine expression in Sufi dance which has been performed traditionally by men only. Her modality, Dance of Oneness® is dance as a spiritual path and science of

embodiment. It is a fusion of 3 dimensions: the art of dance: rigorous technique and self-expression; healing; and wisdom teachings. With an MFA in Dance and Choreography from UCLA and a Masters in Chinese Medicine, she's dedicated to individual and collective healing and liberation through dance. Banafsheh's award-winning solo dances and ensemble work with her dance company, NAMAH, has been presented in North America, Europe and Australia.

From Inland Dance Theater to American Ballet Theatre, Rachel's passion for dance burns bright. Trained by renowned professionals, she mastered a diverse repertoire: ballet, contemporary, jazz, tap, and musical theater. Accepted by both American Ballet Theatre and San Francisco Ballet School, her talent took center stage. In 2013, Rachel's dream unfolded with Reverence Performing Arts Academy, a haven for young dancers producing Nutcrackers, summer ballets, and musicals, showcasing classics like Swan Lake and

Scene 1- Zemestan (Winter)

Winter, with all its beauty and treasures, draws to a close, signalling the magical transition to spring. Nane Sarma, the Winter Queen, bids farewell to the season with a haunting song and dance, promising to return when the next winter arrives. A stirring sound arises from the heart of the soil – the sound of life pushing upward. Spring is on its way. Nowruz celebrates this vibrant rebirth of earth and nature.

Scene 2 - Khāne-takānī (Spring Cleaning)

As the celebration of Nowruz nears, many traditions take place to prepare for its welcoming. One such tradition is khāne-tekānī, which translates to "shaking the house" —and shaking the house they sure do! Traditionally, homes were turned nearly upside down as a practice of cleansing the living environment. Every nook and cranny is given a thorough cleaning and refreshed for the New Year. A very customary aspect of this tradition is the washing of the rugs, windows and curtains, casting out the old years' dust. This act provided a basis for a much needed health routine. This isn't just about cleanliness, but a symbolic purification for a fresh start. The scents of hyacinths and sweet pastries soon fill the air, a fragrant sign that Nowruz is near. This deep cleaning ritual transcends Iran, echoing similar traditions of renewal in China, the U.S., and beyond. Out with the old, in with the new!

After completing these exhaustive cleaning rituals, It's time to step outside, soak up some energy from the warmth of the fire, and rejuvenate.

Scene 3 - Chaharshanbeh Suri

Haji Firooz, the joyous herald of Nowruz, brings music and cheer to the streets. Dressed in vibrant red satin, this troubadour dances and plays the tambourine, spreading news of the approaching New Year. Like Christmas carols signal the holidays, Haji Firooz's presence fills the air with anticipation. To celebrate diversity and unity, NICArt has expanded this traditionally male role to include people of all genders and backgrounds.

Chaharshanbe Suri: Festival of Fire

As the sun sets on the last Tuesday of the year, the ancient tradition of Chaharshanbe Suri ignites. A festival of fire jumping and purification, it's one of the most beloved Nowruz celebrations. People gather around blazing bonfires, taking turns leaping over the flames while chanting, "Give me your beautiful red color and take back my sickly paleness!" They believe fire, with its purifying power, will cleanse them of past ailments and bestow blessings for the new year.



Ghashogh Zani: A Night of Spoons and Spirits

Alongside Chaharshanbe Suri comes the playful tradition of Ghashogh Zani (Spoon Banging). In ages past, people believed they received visits from their ancestors' spirits on the year's final day. To mimic these visits, people wrapped in blankets would roam the streets by firelight, banging pots and pans with spoons to chase away bad luck. This lively custom, much like Halloween's Trick-or-Treating, has faded in modern times, but perhaps it's time for a revival! It's fascinating that despite the distance, Iran and the U.S. share such a similar tradition.

قاشق زنی

در این شب زنان و مردان چهره خود را با چادر نماز می پوشانند و گاه نقابی بر چهره دارن که ناشناس بمانند. آنها با قاشق بر کاسه یا قابلمه میزنند و یا بر در خانه می کوبند و اهل خانه را از آمدن خویش آگاه می کنند. اهل خانه کاسه خالی را با مشتی آذوقه یا گاهاً بجای آذوقه، پول نقد به قاشق زن پرداخت می کنند

فلسفه ٔ قاشق زنی بر این مبناست که توانگران به یاری نیازمندان میشتابند و بدین وسیله موجب خرسندی و دل شادی آنها می شوند

آیین قاشق زنی از آنجا سرچشمه گرفته است که ایرانیان باستان معتقدند که ارواح پاک نیاکان به صورت ناشناس به دیدار بازماندگان می روند و وابستگان برای یاد بود و تجلی روح آنها خیرات و هدیه می دهند



چهارشنبه سوری

جشن چهارشنبه سوری که (کلمه "سور" در زبان فارسی به معنای سرخ بودن، نور و روشنایی است) سنتی دیرینه است که با برگزاری آن مردم با شور و هیجان به استقبال بهاری دل انگیز می روند تا در غروب آخرین سه شنبه سال با آغوشی پر از نور و گرما برای پاک کردن افکار آتشی بیافروزند، کینه ها را بسوزانند، زردی خاطرات بد را به آتش و سرخی عشق و سلامتی را از آتش بگیرند. آتش نفرت را در دلها خاموش کنند و رنگی تازه به روح و روان خود ببخشند

در همین حال و احوال، حاجی فیروز مژده رسیدن بهار را میدهد. رنگ سرخ لباس حاجی فیروز نمادی از تحول در طبیعت است

ایرانیان باستان معتقدند که آتش این عنصر سوزان مظهر پاکیزگی و یکرنگی است

هنگام تاریک شدن هوا با برپا کردن آتش ، شعله های سوزان ، شعاعی از روشنایی ایجاد می کند تا ظلمات شب را مغلوب کنند. در شب چهارشنبه سوری ۳ بوته آتش فروزان برپا می شود که هر یک نشانه ای از ۳ پند بزرگ ایرانیان باستان یعنی رفتار نیک، کردار نیک و پندار نیک است



Scene 4- Haft-Seen

A physical symbol of Nowruz is the arrangement of a Haft-Seen table or sofreh. Haft-Seen, is the tradition of placing 7 symbolic objects on a table whose names commence with the letter "S" in Farsi. These elements are Sabzeh (wheatgrass grown in a dish-rebirth), Samanu (sweet pudding made from wheat germ-sweetness & abundance), Senjed (sweet dried fruit of the lotus tree -love), Serkeh (vinegar-patience & cleansing), Seeb (apple-health & beauty), Seer (garlic-health & medicine) and Somagh (sumac-sunrise as the spice of life). Other common symbols to be placed on the table include a candle (light), mirror (self-reflection), painted eggs (fertility), goldfish (life), gold coins (wealth) and a book of wisdom or holy book, or more commonly a book of poetry by Hafez, Saadi, or Ferdosi. Just as Christmas is most recognized by a decorated tree, so is the Haft-Seen for Nowruz.

هفت سین

هفتسین سفره ای است که ایرانیان و پارسی زبانان هنگام نوروز میآرایند. این سفره، منشور همبستگی در رنجها و شادیها است و عدد هفت عددی خوش یمن و نشانه ٔ جاودانه بودن است. همه افراد خانواده با عشق، صفا ، صمیمیت و پاکی در زمان تحویل سال در کنار سفره هفتسین مینشینند. رسم است که سفره را تا سیزده روز پس از نوروز نگه میدارند

سفره هفت سین اشاره به هفت سمبل است که با حرف سین شروع می شود و دارای نام پارسی هستند و ریشه گیاهی دارند که عبارتند از سبزه – نماد نوزایی و تولد مجدد سیر – نماد تندرستی و مناعت طبع سیر – نماد زیبایی و سلامتی سیب سرخ – نماد زیبایی و سلامتی

سرکه - نماد صبر و بردباری

سمنو - نماد قدرت و برکت

سماق - رنگ طلوع آفتاب و نماد زندگی

سنجد - نماد عشق جاویدان

در کنار هفت سین، برای زینت و کامل کردن سفره، نمادهای دیگری نیز با مفاهیمی چون باروری، زایش، فراوانی و ثروت قرار میگیرند. از جمله می توان از آینه(نماد جهان بی پایان و بی ریاو انعکاس دهندهٔ زیباییها)، کتاب قرآن و یا هر کتاب مقدس از قبیل دیوان حافظ و شاهنامهٔ فردوسی (نماد ایمان و توکل) شمع (به تعداداعضای خانواده و نماد روشنایی جاودانه)، تخم مرغ رنگی (نماد پیوستگی و همبستگی نژادها و افزایش نسلها)، گندم(نماد برکت)، شیرینی(نمادشیرین کامی)، آب و گلاب (نماد تازگی و باروری) عسل یا شکر(نماد شیرینی زندگی)، ماهی قرمز(نماد سلامتی)، انار یا ترنج شناور در آب (نماد شناوری زمین در کیهان) را نام برد



Scene 5 - Bahar (Spring)

Nowruz is the Spring Equinox, when the sun rotates exactly one full circle around the earth and reaches a point where the length of night and day are equal. From this moment on, Spring begins with the official sounds of Nowruz, Sorna and Dohol, as they ignite joy and commence the arrival of spring celebrations.

Amoo Nowruz is a symbol of Nowruz and a legendary figure in Iranian folklore. Amoo Nowruz is a wise old man with white hair and beard who brings gifts to children, similar to Santa Claus on Christmas Eve. He is accompanied by Lady Spring, a blossoming beauty representing all the floral scents and beauties of Spring. Haji Firooz also sings, dances and announces the arrival of spring with a tambourine in his hand.

Scene 7- Sizdah Bedar (Nature Day)

Sizdah Bedar is an Iranian festival held annually on the thirteenth day of Farvardin (the first month of the Iranian calendar), during which people spend time picnicking outdoors. It is an official holiday in Iran, known as Nature Day. During their outdoor gatherings, families dance, eat and celebrate each other and the coming new year. At the end of the picnic, the "Sabzeh"-wheat sprout- they've grown is discarded into a flowing river/stream taking away the bad omens of the year.

It is also customary for young single people, especially young women, to tie the leaves of the greenery before discarding it, expressing a wish to find a partner.


In addition to all the fun, "Lie of the Thirteen" is the Iranian version of the prank-playing April Fools' Day which is practiced on this day.






